MECHANICS FOR QUIZ BEE

- A. The competition is open to all Grade 10 and 12 Students, public and private schools, composed of three (3) representatives per school.
- B. The coverage of the quiz bee includes General Education Subjects: English, Filipino, Science, Mathematics, Literature and Social Sciences
- C. The group will write their answers at the white board provided by the organizer.
- D. All groups will answer the same set of questions in writing. Before the question is read, the group must raise their markers (white board pen).
- E. There will be three (3) components in the competition namely: Elimination Round, Semi-Final Round and the Final Round.
- F. The elimination round has ten (10) questions worth 2 points, the semi-final round has ten (10) questions worth 3 points and in the final round has ten (10) questions worth 5 points.
- G. In the elimination round, only the top six (6) groups will qualify to the next (semi-final) round.
- H. At the end of semi-final round, only the top three (3) groups will move to the final round.
- I. The questions will be read by the quizmaster twice.
- J. After the second (2nd) reading, the Quizmaster shall say "go", only then the groups be allowed to write their answers. Automatically, the (10) second timelimit will begin with the word "go" by the Quizmaster.
- K. After the time-limit, the buzzer will be pressed by the time-keeper. The groups must stop writing and must raise their answer boards.
- L. The Quizmaster shall read and verify the groups answer.
- M. The group who gets the highest number of points is automatically declared the champion or the runner-up as the case may be.
- N. The duly registered teacher coach of the contestant is the only person authorized to make a protest.
- O. All protest should be referred to the Board of Judges immediately, before the Quizmaster reads the next question.
- P. The Board of Judges shall be in complete control of the contest. Their decision shall be final in all questions/ protests.

MECHANICS FOR SOLO SINGING IDOL

- A. Open to Grade 10 and 12 students public and private schools. One entry per school is allowed
- B. The contestant will sing a song with a maximum time limit of 5 minutes. Beyond this limit, a total of five (5) points will be deducted from the total score.
- C. Medley arrangement of songs is not allowed.

MECHANICS FOR HATAW SAYAW DANCE COMPETITION

- A. Open to Grade 10 and 12 students public and private schools. One entry per school is allowed.
- B. Each group will perform to any dance music with a maximum time limit of 5 minutes. Beyond this limit, a total of five (5) points will be deducted from the group's total score.
- C. Each group will have a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 6 members.
- D. The members of the group may be composed of all males or females, or any combination thereof.
- E. The dance number must have the accompaniment of a modern and lively music.
- F. Folk dances or accompaniment of folk music is not allowed.
- G. The use of pyrotechnic gadgets, smoke or combustible materials as props is not allowed.
- H. Tumbling and other stunts is not allowed.

MECHANICS SEARCH FOR MR. & MS. UPHS

- A. Open to Grade 10 and 12 students public and private schools. One pair per school is allowed.
- B. Each contestant will be required to prepare the following outfits:
 - * CASUAL WEAR
 - * SPORTS WEAR (depicting any sport/physical exercise)
 Note: swimsuits/trunks are not allowed
 - * FORMAL WEAR any evening attire Note: revealing gowns are not allowed
- C. The pageant will be composed of 4 competitions:
 - 1. Casual Wear
 - 2. Sports Wear
 - 3. Formal Wear
 - 4. Question & Answer portion
- D. All the contestants' scores from Casual, Sports, Formal Wear and Question Answer will be averaged.
- E. Another set of the Q & A portion shall be given to the top five finalists.

II. CRITERIA

Judges will give the contestant for each competition a score from 70-100 points based on these criteria.

- A. Casual Wear (poise/posture, grace/elegance, stage projection, casual outfit)
 - B. Sports Wear (physique, grace, stage projection, sports outfit)
- C. Formal Wear (poise/posture, grace/elegance, stage projection, formal outfit)
 - D. Q & A Portion (wit/intelligence, personality development)
