Paglaum South Events in cooperation with ETR Film Production together with ETR Total Business Solution Provider present for special screenings of an inspiring biopic film "ANG BOYSCOUT NA BAYANI – OSCAR M. ALCARAZ STORY". The film tells the story about the tragic but very heroic death of a brave Scout and Junior Forest Ranger, Oscar M. Alcaraz, then a student of the Eulogio Rodriguez Jr. High School. On August 30, 1970 (Sunday and National Heroes' Day), Oscar M. Alcaraz lost his life in saving his scout master, but he did not die in vain because he gave his life so that others may live. In recognition of his gallantry and heroism, he was conferred the Gold Medal of Honor by the Boy Scouts of the Philippines, the Presidential Medal of Merit posthumously by President Ferdinand E. Marcos in a solemn and touching ceremony at the Malacañan Palace on September 11, 1970 and also by virtue of an Administrative Order his body was ordered transferred and the first civilian to be interred at the Libingan ng mga Bayani, Fort Bonifacio on October 31, 1970.

OSCAR M. ALCARAZ: ANG BOY SCOUT NA TUNAY NA BAYANI

The ETR Films presents the biographical film, Oscar M. Alcaraz: Ang Boy Scout Na Tunay Na Bayani, featuring the first civilian to be given the honor of being laid to rest at the Libingan ng mga Bayani (Heroes' Cemetery), in Fort Bonifacio.

Scout Alcaraz, then a student of the Eulogio Rodriguez Jr. High School in La Loma, Quezon City, was born on May 4, 1953. He died a heroic death when he unselfishly saved the life of his drowning Scoutmaster during a reforestation project at the La Mesa Dam in Novaliches, Quezon City.

Led by multi-awarded child performer Robert "Buboy" Tamayo Villar Jr., the film showcases the gallantry and heroism of Scout Oscar, and how he deserved the Presidential Merit and Medal conferred by then President Ferdinand E. Marcos on September 11, 1970, at the Malacanan Palace.

Directed by Antonio San Agustin, kdpp, the movie commenced in March 2023, both internationally and locally.







Ang Bayaning Boy Scout na si Oscar M. Alcaraz

Araw ng Linggo, August 30, 1970, nagkaroon ng field trip assignment ang Boy Scout of the Philippines (BSP) na suriin ang mga bagong tanim na puno malapit sa La Mesa Dam. Kasama sa mga inatasang magpunta ay si Oscar M. Alcaraz, na noon ay 17 years old, at 22 boy scouts. Natagpuan nila ang binahang taniman na dulot ng bagyong humagupit noong nakaraang linggo.

Pabalik na sila sa kanilang campsite nang biglang matapakan ng kanilang scout leader ang dulo ng tulay at tuluyang nahulog sa tubig. Nagmadaling lumusong si leader sa tubig ng walang pagaatubili at pagdadawalang isip. Matagumpay niyang naitulak ang leader sa mas mababaw na parte ngunit siya naman ang tinangay ng tubig.

"Huwag kayong tumalon, malalim na dito!" Ito ang sigaw ni Oscar sa mga kasamahan na tila pagbabanta sa panganib na maaaring mangyari. Nagkapit-bisig ang mga kasama ni Oscar at sinubukang siyang abutin ngunit sa masamang pagkakataon, hindi nila siya nailigtas. Natagpuan ang katawan ni Oscar ng Philippine Navy sa sumunod na araw.

Dahil sa kabayanihang ipinamalas ni Oscar, ginawaran siya ng Gold Medal of Honor ng BSP at Presidential Medal of Merit. Siya ang pinakabata at unang sibilyan na inilibing sa Libingan ng mga Bayani. Ipinangalan din sa kanya ang Sct. Oscar M. Alcaraz Street, isang kalye sa Quezon City.

The heroism of boy scout Oscar M. Alcaraz

MANILA -- I recalled an old story I wrote about the tragic but very heroic death of a brave 17-year-boy scout at the La Mesa Dam in Novaliches, Quezon City in August 1970.

That boy scout was Oscar M. Alcaraz, then a student of the Eulogio Rodriguez Jr. High School (ERJHS) in La Loma District, Quezon City.

The Boy Scouts of the Philippines (BSP), the National Reforestation Administration (NRA), the Department of Education and Culture (DEC) and the Philippine National Bank (PNB) were then undertaking a reforestation project at the vast Novaliches reservoir, which was being administered by the former National Waterworks and Sewerage Administration (NWSA), the predecessor of the present Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System or MWSS.

Alcaraz, born on May 4, 1953, was a member of the ERJHS Drum and Bugle Corps and among the participants in the reforestation project.

On Aug. 30, 1970 (Sunday and National Heroes' Day), the young Alcaraz was with a group of 22 boy scouts, led by Scouter Temistocles E. Amper, then assistant camp director and activities officer of the La Mesa Dam Reforestation Project, on assignment to inspect newly-planted tree seedlings when the tragedy occurred. The tree seedlings were submerged in water due to a recent typhoon that hit Luzon, including Metro Manila, that last week of August.

According to the very first police report I got at the then Quezon City Police Department (QCPD) Precinct 6 based at Novaliches town proper, as the group hiked on the trail along the dam going back to their campsite, Amper, who was ahead, accidentally stepped on the edge of the embankment and fell into the deep water.

Upon seeing this, Alcaraz rushed to the scene. He immediately jumped into the water and successfully pushed Amper toward the bank; but, had in the process thrown himself into the deeper portion of the dam.

Aware of the danger he was in, Alcaraz shouted to warn his companions: "Do not jump; it's too deep in this part."

The other scouts tried to reach him by forming a human chain but to no avail until Alcaraz finally sank. They tried to seek help from the La Mesa Dam workers and divers, but they too were not able to locate him. His body was eventually recovered by Philippine Navy frogmen the next day.

Alcaraz, who would have been 66 years this year, lost his life in saving his scout master on National Heroes' Day, but he did not die in vain. In recognition of his gallantry and heroism, he was conferred the Gold Medal of Honor by the BSP and the Presidential Medal of Merit posthumously by then President Ferdinand E. Marcos in a solemn ceremony in Malacañang on Sept. 11, 1970.

In addition, by virtue of an Administrative Order, his remains were ordered transferred from the Manila North Cemetery to the Libingan ng mga Bayani (Heroes' Cemetery) in Fort Bonifacio on Oct. 31, 1970. He became the first civilian and the youngest to be buried there at that time.

Also, the Quezon City Council enacted an ordinance renaming in his memory Morong St. in the city's first district as Sct. Oscar M. Alcaraz Street.

At present, Sct. Oscar M. Alcaraz St. is one of about two dozen thoroughfares in QC, which have been renamed after boy scout heroes.
