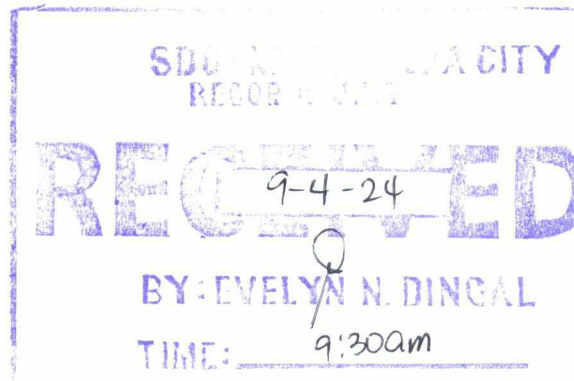

As the Girl Scouts of the Philippines (GSP) begins the new triennium, the **Girl Scout Week Celebration** on **September 15-21, 2024** adopts the theme of the 26<sup>th</sup> National Council Convention (NCC) **“Women of Today for the Girls of Tomorrow”**.



The theme highlights GSP’s unwavering commitment to unity, sisterhood, and the advancement of young girls – the advocacy started by its Founder, Josefa Llanes Escoda (JLE).

Girl Scouts all over the country are enjoined to participate in the week-long celebration. Hence, the Regions/Councils are encouraged to implement the suggested activities below or plan other creative and exciting activities relative to the theme.

<p><b>Day 1</b> <b>(Sunday)</b></p>	<p><b>September 15 - FAITH DAY</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Participate actively in a Worship Service such as Holy Mass, Prayers Meetings, Praise and Thanksgiving Services, Sabbath, etc.</li> <li>- Make a Gratitude List of God’s Blessings in your life. List down as many as you can, no matter how big or small the blessing is, and take time to thank God for His Divine providence. You may share your list with your family, friends, or on social media as well.</li> <li>- Find and read some stories in the Bible, Koran, or biographies of saints. Reflect on the special characteristics you have found in the books or stories you have read.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Day 2</b> <b>(Monday)</b></p>	<p><b>September 16 – GIRLS’ DAY</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Hold activities that will develop girl’s self esteem, body confidence, and nutrition. You may refer to Free Being Me/Action on Body Confidence Activity Packs and Girl Powered Nutrition Program resources.</li> <li>- Conduct a seminar/workshop on gender equality and women empowerment.</li> <li>- Organize a Girl Scouts Got Talent Contest to express girls’ creativity, showcase their skills, and build their confidence and character.</li> </ul>

<b>Day 3 (Tuesday)</b>	<b>September 17 – TROOP LEADERS’ DAY (TEACHERS’ DAY)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Hold a recognition ceremony for active Troop Leaders.</li> <li>- Create a traditional or digital artwork for your Troop Leader and post it on your social media account.</li> <li>- Send an appreciation direct message to your Troop Leader or make an appreciation social media post about their impact to your life.</li> </ul>
<b>Day 4 (Wednesday)</b>	<b>September 18 – ENVIRONMENT DAY</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Initiate or join a community activity like coastal clean-up, tree planting, beautification of an area, vegetable gardening, etc.</li> <li>- Conduct a forum about climate change and other environmental issues.</li> <li>- Make it a daily habit to reduce your carbon footprint by conserving energy, practicing 3Rs, choosing sustainable products, etc.</li> </ul>
<b>Day 5 (Thursday)</b>	<b>September 19 – COMMUNITY / PARTNERSHIP DAY</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Organize a community pantry or a soup kitchen for a day.</li> <li>- Have a storytelling session with daycare students or zumba dance class for mothers/senior citizens in your barangay.</li> <li>- Invite resource speakers to teach first aid, emergency response, and ham radio.</li> </ul>
<b>Day 6 (Friday)</b>	<b>September 20 – ESCODA DAY</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Hold Escoda Ceremony and contribute to the JLE Memento Fund.</li> <li>- Conduct a JLE Conference to be led by Senior and Cadet Planning Board (SCPB). See attached conference guidelines and program.</li> <li>- Learn about the life of JLE and GSP historical milestones.</li> </ul>
<b>Day 7 (Saturday)</b>	<b>September 21 – FAMILY DAY</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Spend quality time with your family by playing board games, making crafts, preparing snacks, cooking, gardening, or doing any other fun activities to foster good family relations.</li> <li>- Draw your family tree together and share stories about each of the family member.</li> <li>- Hold a Family Day or a Family Camp.</li> </ul>

We also highly suggest to resume holding the JLE Conference at the Council level which was halted during the COVID-19 pandemic. It is a one-day girl-led Council Conference spearheaded by the Senior and Cadet Planning Board (SCPB) Officers together with Council Girl Representatives. The JLE Conference is expected to be simultaneously conducted in all Councils on September 20, 2024 within the Girl Scout Week Celebration. Please see **JLE Guidelines (Attachment A)** to serve as reference of the Council Planning Team.

We look forward to your usual active participation.
