**SUBJECT :** 2024 INTERNATIONAL COASTAL CLEAN-UP

1. **Presidential Proclamation No. 470 Series of 2003**, declared the **Third (3<sup>rd</sup>) Saturday of September of each year** as the "International Coastal Clean-Up Day". This year's International Coastal Clean-Up will be celebrated on the third Saturday of this month - September 21, 2024.
2. International Coastal Cleanup aims to **engage people around the world to remove trash and debris from beaches, waterways and other water bodies**, to identify the sources of the litter, to change behaviors that causes pollution and to raise awareness on the extent of the marine debris problem.
3. Taking into consideration the environmental educational and sustainability program of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines, all Scouts and Scout Leaders are encouraged to initiate the conduct of a clean-up drive activity that include cleaning and collecting trashes that pollutes our waterways at homes, schools, communities, public plazas, parks, coastal areas, forest areas, watershed areas, campsites and other suitable areas.
4. Documentary and pictorial report indicating the actual clean-up drive shall be uploaded to <https://bit.ly/CommunityServiceReport> and <https://sites.google.com/site/iccphilippines/home>.
5. Download the Clean Swell app <https://sites.google.com/site/iccphilippines/about-icc/clean-swell-app> on your mobile phone. This app is simply "Start Collecting" trash wherever you are around the world and the data you collect will instantaneously upload to Ocean Conservancy's global ocean trash database. These data deliver a global snapshot of ocean trash, providing researchers and policy-makers insight to inform solutions.

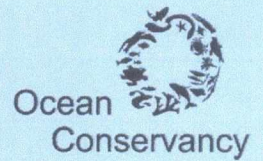

**GENERAL PROGRAMME ACTIVITY GUIDE FOR THE  
INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE 2024**

**What Scouts Messengers of Peace Can Do to celebrate at the Local Level?**

Scouts all over the country can help contribute in building the culture of peace by raising the level of awareness of more young people in this pandemic situation. That our Scouts will do better and far beyond their expectations of giving peace a great deal of participation even in the midst of health crisis. Let us share and give our part to have Peace for ourselves and share this smile to our brother and sister Scouts, by participating in these worthwhile activities:

1. **"PEACE STARTS WITH ME" SELFIE.** Make your presence felt online, engage yourself and let your fellow Scouts know that you want to make a difference. Take a shot of you wearing your Scout Neckerchief with a relevant peace background and post "Peace Starts with Me" or "Ang Kapayapaan ay Nagsisimula sa Akin" Write your "peace message" and share via facebook, twitter, instagram and other social media platforms. It takes a simple act of kindness to one single person everyday will surely make an impact! Use the hashtag #MoPPh #peaceday and #scoutsmessengersofpeace
2. **"PEACE TALK" VIDEO.** Be an online sensation via youtube or facebook live. Try to inspire more Scouts and young people to call for action in creating peace. Using your smart phones or tablets, shoot at least 15-30 seconds video with your Scout friend and talk about the following. Share to media platform and make an impact.
  - a. What does peace means to you?
  - b. What do you think you can do to promote peace?
  - c. What are global issues that affect us in our community?
  - d. What is your message for other people about peace?
3. **"PEACE TALK" RADIO.** If we can reach more we can inspire more. Contact your local radio stations asking for a possible time slot to talk about "how scouts contribute to peace through service". Invite people to join our global effort to promote Peace Culture with small acts of kindness and become part of the 200 million people united together to create a better world in our Global invite them to Scout.org.
  - Step 1: Make a database of radios with number and sdgs.scout.org;
  - Step 2: Make database radios with number and contact person;
  - Step 3: Contact them to ask for a space to talk about Scouts and Peace Day;
  - Step 4: Schedule accordingly with the radios accepting to have you;
  - Step 5: Prepare some key points to use in your interview. Share it with other Scouts if they are also joining. Prepare a certificate or token of appreciation for the radio;
  - Step 6: Go and enjoy the radio world. Ask someone to record or ask the radio to provide you with the recording.
4. **"PAPER CRANES" CHALLENGE.** This was launched during the last 23rd World Scout Jamboree in Japan. Scout Groups may invite and/or join an art class and do the "Paper Crane" Origami. Explain the symbolism of "paper crane" to peace. Use assorted color papers, write your "peace message" and fold it into paper cranes. Make an art gallery of paper cranes with peace message and share it to everyone. Post it in social media; share via facebook, twitter, instagram and other social media platforms. It takes a simple act of kindness. Use the hashtag #MoPPh #peaceday and #scoutsmessengersofpeace #MessengersOfPeace.

5. **"THE ART FOR PEACE" EXPRESSIONS (Slogan Making).** Together with "paper crane" Back to artistic skills, try to make a slogan, poster and painting from your own creation expressing Peace or sending a message. Theme **"Shaping Peace Together."** The technique and materials are free to choose from. If you have materials or resources, print your poster or make a banner of it. If possible use recycled material. Share the image in Scout.org and social media. Post it in social media; share via facebook, twitter, instagram and other social media platforms. Use the hashtag #MoPPh #peaceday and #scoutsmessengersofpeace
6. **"BAYBAYIN LECTURE."** An alphasyllabary is one of the individual writing system used in Southeast Asia, nearly all of which are abugidas; where any consonant is pronounced with the inherent vowel a following it – diacritics being used to express other vowels. Many of these writing systems descended from ancient writings used in India over 200 years ago, and the collective term for the Abugidas in the Philippines is Baybayin.
7. **Contribution to SDGs.** As an active global citizen, Scouts also have the responsibility to take actions contributing to the Sustainable Development Goals. These are some action that you may take based of SDGs;

8. **Service Hours and Service Projects.** All these challenges will be counted under your Service Hours. Compute the number of participants who joined in the service and or promotion of peace advocacy multiplied by the number of hours spent per participant or usually the duration of the activity and logged on to [www.sdgs.scout.org](http://www.sdgs.scout.org)
9. **Social Media.** The main objective of this activity is to promote action in the field, raise awareness and get Scouts involved in interaction with Non-Scouts to talk about Peace Culture. The easiest way to promote and create a replication effect is with the **support of social media.** We encourage everyone, in addition to upload your service projects on <http://sdgs.scout.org/>, to make use of the existing Facebook Pages/Groups <https://www.facebook.com/groups/mop.apr/> and your own national administered sites to upload your projects and stories.
