SUBJECT : 2025 NATIONAL CELEBRATION OF TECH-VOC

DATE : November 4, 2025

1. Pursuant to **Republic Act No. 10970**, which declares the **Twenty-Fifth (25th) Day of August of Every Year as the National Tech-Voc Day**, the Department of Education (DepEd) encourages all public and private elementary and secondary schools to observe the **2025 National Tech-Voc Day**.
2. This observance underscores the vital importance of **Technical and Vocational Education** in producing a highly skilled workforce for national development. DepEd, in particular, offers Senior High School learners with Tech-Voc programs designed to prepare them for immediate entry into world of work.
3. Considering this, DepEd Region IV-A (CALABARZON) will host its culminating event, **2025 National Celebration of Tech-Voc** with the theme "**Empowering Skills, Building Better Future Careers**" on **Tuesday, November 25, 2025**. This culminating event will be conducted in collaboration with various government agencies, partner industries, and private entities. The specific venue shall be announced through a subsequent advisory.
4. The celebration aims to:
 - 4.1 Present the initiatives of DepEd and other partner agencies aimed at strengthening Technical-Vocational Education; and
 - 4.2 Highlight successful partnerships that showcase exemplary industry-academic collaboration.



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5. Participants and Delegations:

5.1 Each region is requested to send four (4) official participants, composed of the following:

- One (1) Regional Director or Schools Division Superintendent
- One (1) TLE Regional Supervisor
- One (1) TLE Division Supervisor
- One (1) School Head

5.2 **Regions III, IV-A, and NCR** are likewise requested to send an **additional fifty (50) participants** each. This additional delegation should be composed of other field officials, including teachers and learners, to maximize representation and participation in the event.

6. The official field-level participants from regions, **excluding** Regions III, IV-A, and NCR, will have one (1) night accommodation on **November 24, 2025**. However, all attendees will be provided with meals (breakfast, lunch, and snacks) during the event.
7. Funds for their transportation expenses have already been downloaded to the regions in August 2025. The specific allocation of participant-slots per region is detailed in the attached document.
8. In adherence to existing policies—specifically, Order No. 9, s. 2005 (Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task), Order No. 012, s. 2025 (Multi-Year Implementing Guidelines on the School Calendar and Activities), and Memorandum No. 2022-058 (Request for the Participation of Learners and Teachers in Extra-Curricular Activities)—**classes shall not be disrupted**. The time utilized for both event preparation and the actual participation must be sourced from the hours allocated for specialized subjects such as **EPP/TLE/SPTVE/TVL**.
