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### III. Criteria for Leadership Bootcamp - Top 50 Teachers

Criteria	Description	Percentage
<b>Professional Competence</b>	Assesses the teacher's mastery of subject content and ability to apply financial literacy concepts in the classroom	30%
<b>Leadership and Initiative</b>	Evaluates the teacher's ability to lead, influence, and initiate meaningful actions toward improving financial literacy in their school or community.	25%
<b>Commitment and Engagement</b>	Measures dedication to the AFLT Certification program and willingness to grow as an educator and financial literacy advocate	25%
<b>Innovation and Creativity</b>	Assesses the teacher's ability to generate creative, practical, and learner-centered approaches to teaching financial literacy.	20%

### IV. Requirements

To qualify for the Leadership Bootcamp, the educators must complete the following:

- A **Lesson Plan** with Integration of Financial Literacy Concepts
- A **Short Reflection Essay** - explaining why the educator wants to join the Leadership Bootcamp and how they plan to apply the learnings in their classroom or school community
- **Endorsement Letter** – signed by the School Head or Principal supporting the teacher's participation
- The educators must **pass the AFLT Examination** with a **60% passing rate**.

**V. Awards and Incentives**

To further recognize excellence and participation, **special awards and incentives** will be given during the program:

1. **Best Region Award** - demonstrates the **most outstanding overall performance** in the AFLT Certification Program. This includes excellence in program implementation, participant engagement, innovation, and consistent support to divisions and schools. The Region will receive **150,000 Pesos** as a reward

Criteria	Description	Percentage
<b>Program Implementation</b>	Timeliness, completeness, and quality of AFLT program rollout across the region; adherence to guidelines	30%
<b>Participant Engagement &amp; Completion</b>	Number and percentage of participating schools, teachers, and learners; overall completion and certification rates.	25%
<b>Innovation and Best Practices</b>	Introduction of new strategies, creative approaches, and contextualized activities that enhance program delivery.	25%
<b>Support to Divisions and Schools</b>	Provision of guidance, mentoring, monitoring, and technical assistance to ensure successful implementation.	20%

The **Region** must comply the following documents on or before **March 27, 2026** :

- **Regional Accomplishment Report** - Summarizing overall implementation, milestones, and outputs.
- **Program Implementation and Monitoring** - Including timelines, activities conducted, and progress updates
- **Documentation of Innovations and Best Practices** - Evidence of creative strategies, localized approaches, and successful initiatives.

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- **Endorsement or Certification from the Regional Director** - Confirming the authenticity and completeness of submitted documents.
2. **Best Division Award** – for the division with the **most number of passers**. The division will receive **100,000 Pesos** as a reward

Criteria	Description	Percentage
<b>Number of AFLT Certification Passers</b>	Total number of certified passers in the division relative to enrollment/participation.	80%
<b>Division-Led Initiatives</b>	Number and percentage of participating schools, teachers, and learners; overall completion and certification rates.	20%

3. **Best School Award** – for the school demonstrating **outstanding engagement and implementation**. The school will receive **50,000 Pesos** as a reward.

Criteria	Description	Percentage
<b>Engagement Level</b>	Active participation of teachers and learners; involvement in AFLT activities; completion rates.	40%
<b>Quality of Implementation</b>	Organized and effective execution of the AFLT Certification Program within the school; compliance with guidelines.	40%
<b>Innovation &amp; Contextualization</b>	Use of creative, localized, or innovative practices to deliver financial literacy learning.	20%

4. **Teacher of the Year Award** – honoring an educator who exemplifies **innovation, leadership, and dedication in financial literacy education**. The teacher will receive **50,000 Pesos** as a reward.

<b>Instructional Excellence</b>	Ability to deliver financial literacy concepts clearly and effectively; learner performance	40%

<b>Innovative Teaching Strategies</b>	Use of technology, creative methods, or contextualized approaches to enhance AFLT learning.	30%
<b>Advocacy &amp; Leadership in Financial Literacy</b>	Initiatives that promote financial literacy beyond the classroom (school events, community activities, mentoring).	20%
<b>Professional Conduct &amp; Commitment</b>	Dedication, punctuality, collaboration, and overall adherence to program standards.	10%

#### **VI. Eligibility Criteria, Evaluation Process, and General Provisions**

1. **Purpose** - The awards aim to acknowledge exemplary performance, encourage active participation, and inspire continuous improvement in the implementation of the AFLT Certification Program across regions, divisions, schools, and educators.
2. **Eligibility** - Only officially participating regions, divisions, schools, and teachers involved in the AFLT Certification Program are eligible for nomination and evaluation.
3. **Evaluation Period** - Performance will be assessed based on accomplishments during the official program cycle, as determined by the AFLT Program Management Team.
4. **Awarding** - All awards and incentives will be conferred during the official culminating activity or recognition ceremony of the AFLT Certification Program.
