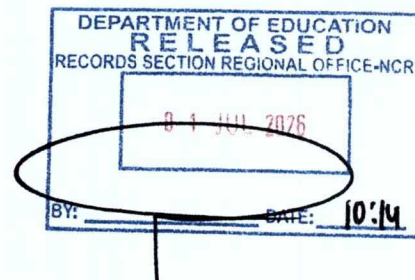



Recognizing the vital role of partnerships in addressing the evolving needs of the education sector, the Department of Education (DepEd) continues to strengthen collaboration with government agencies, private organizations, civil society groups, and other stakeholders to support the delivery of quality, accessible, relevant, and inclusive basic education. This direction is consistent with the recommendations of the Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM II) Year II Report under Priority Area 26, which highlights the need to increase investments in education. Through these collaborative efforts, DepEd aims to mobilize additional resources, expertise, and support mechanisms that will contribute to improving learning environments and expanding opportunities for learners nationwide.

As part of this effort, the External Partnerships Service (EPS) – Adopt-A-School Secretariat has conceptualized the **2026 Adopt-A-School Caravan** as a marketing and advocacy activity aimed at expanding partnership opportunities at the local level. The caravan will serve as a platform for promoting investments in education through the Adopt-A-School Program (ASP) and encouraging greater stakeholder participation in supporting schools.

The caravan will feature the enhanced ASP Menu of Investments, the ASP Platform, and the proposed amendments to Republic Act No. 8525. Moreover, the activity will provide *opportunities for stakeholders and beneficiary schools to establish new partnerships, promoting mutually beneficial relationships that contribute to improved educational outcomes.*

To ensure wider reach and increased participation in the ASP, DepEd, in collaboration with the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR), and the Education
